#### Marian A conversation with the President



I caught up with Dale Romme, new Serra Club President, to talk about Serra and gauge his thoughts as he takes up the reins of the club. For those who don't know, Dale is very engaging and, self-admittedly, not short for words. We talked for almost an hour on a recent Sunday afternoon!

"When and why did you join Serra?" I asked. "I joined Serra in about 2018. My good friend, John Hense, had told me about Serra during our time at KU," Romme began. "His father, Jack Hense, was a charter member and long-time JOCO Serran. I thought it was just great that there were groups (like Serrans) and parishes that prayed for their parish priest!" he continued. "After Jack Hense's funeral Mass (in August 2020) I knew I had made a good

decision," he observed. "I am blessed by the friends I have in Serra."

Romme, who graduated from Thomas More Prep School in Hays, KS, related that he had thought very seriously about becoming a priest during his high school and college years. It was during his time at KU that the new St. Lawrence Center was being completed. Both Fr. Vince Krische and Fr. Bill Porter were influential. "After I got my Chemical Engineering degree, I worked for them for a year, doing maintenance and running social programs for students," Romme reflected. The job went so well that he continued working there while finishing an MBA. "Fr. Bill Bruning was in my discernment group, as was Fr. Steve Besau," Dale recalled, "and look where they are," he added with a chuckle. "I just never pulled the trigger. God clearly had another plan for my life." And that plan was about to become a bit clearer.

Romme went to work for Hallmark after completing his MBA. During the early days at Hallmark, two things happened. "I continued my discernment through conversations with Fr. Tom Tank and Fr. Mike Scully. "And then I met this beautiful young woman whose name was Catherine Rowe," he said. "Our 30<sup>th</sup> wedding anniversary will be May 21," he added. I imagined the smile on his face as I heard the pride and the sentiment in his voice as we spoke on the phone. Catherine, too, worked at Hallmark at the time. "You know, God has a plan for each of us. For some, it takes a bit longer to see it," he mused.

Catherine and Dale Romme have three children, Elizabeth, Matthew, and Caroline, of whom Dale is very proud. "They are such an incredible blessing to us," he observed, his voice again filled with pride and the sentiment that only a father can know when speaking about his children. While Dale continues work at Hallmark, now a 33-year veteran of the team, Catherine has taught at St. Michael the Archangel School for 18 years. The couple's parish home is Holy Trinity in Lenexa.

I asked Dale what drew him into club leadership.

"You know, I'm sort of wired that way. I don't look for leadership opportunities as much as they seem to find me," he said, adding, "This is my way of giving back." Somewhat as an afterthought, he continued, "And I have no problem asking people to help!" He laughed once again. Romme related that when out-going President, John Weber, took office, "the President-Elect position was open, and no one stepped into the role." Though he was less than a year in the club and had no other leadership experience, Romme confessed that he wanted to attend the Board meetings, "because I saw that was where the work of the club starts." Romme felt the tug to volunteer for the role.

"This isn't just Dale's group," he continued. "This is our group. A good leader brings everyone to the table and then observes what shakes out." Another thought came, "You know," he said, "our priests and seminarians need us. Sometimes, we're the ones out in the fields fighting the war for our priests. In our jobs, we're witnessing and evangelizing a lot," he said. "We need each other."

What are Dale's goals for his term as President?

While committing to becoming more purposeful at inviting guests to meetings, Dale identified his first goal: an increase in membership participation in club activities. "Participation in activities is where the club's work is achieved. I would like to see more folks involved in volunteering/joining in the activities of the club." Romme specifically mentioned interacting with seminarians directly, particularly in the annual visits to either Kenrick-Glennon Seminary (St. Louis) or to St. John Vianney Seminary (Denver). "Those guys need to see us and know that we support them. It was so great, also, to see them in their environment and learn a bit about the life they lead during their seminary years." he said.

A second goal is to increase the touchpoints between Serrans and the seminarians. "You know, we talked about a Christmas holiday get-together that didn't come to fruition. It seems to me that we could find a way to create another touchpoint or two," Dale offered. "We will need to be alert to creative ways to make this happen," concluding his thought about this second goal.

Finally, he added his desire for the club to become missionary in outreach to priests in rural parishes. "I believe we have a big opportunity to support priests out there in rural communities," he said, adding, "and we need to discover what that looks like." Amen, Mr. President!
